¹³Although Texas University (Southwestern University) opened for classes in 1873, the school crest shows 1872, since that was the year the decision was made to create a central Methodist school. However, since the formation of the college represented the consolidation of earlier efforts, including Rutgersville College, the founding date is sometimes shown as 1840. Dr. Mood himself preferred the earlier date.

¹⁴Cody, p. 315. Note: When Texas University opened in 1873 it offered, in addition to college-level courses, preparatory, elementary, and primary school programs. Since these latter two programs were soon discontinued, their enrollment figures were not included in the figures given in the text. On opening day, there were 33 college students and approximately 70 in other programs.
